Children's Christmas Party

Any child who has not been collected by their parent/ carer will have to remain behind at the nursery with staff as unfortunately staff are not insured to transport children in their cars. However, parents/ carers are free to make arrangements between themselves in order to help one another out with transport.

This arrangement has worked really well for the past couple of years. With parents/ carers' help and co-operation we have always managed to get every child to the venue in plenty of time before the party started.

Once all these big decisions have been made by the children, we will inform parents/ carers which role their child has finally settled on.

And Finally

Unfortunately, our lovely summer days are behind us and we have reached the time of year where bugs of every sort are rife. This happens at this time every year in schools and nurseries up and down the country.

We would like to take this opportunity to inform you that here at Toy Box we take the health and wellbeing of all the children in our care very seriously.

If a child becomes unwell whilst in our care with any ailment that could be considered contagious (rashes, sickness etc) we contact the parents/ carers immediately and the child is sent home. We always follow the exclusion period guidelines provided to us by the Health Protection Unit.

We employ a General Assistant whose main role is to ensure that cleanliness and hygiene standards are always maintained.

Combined with our usual daily cleaning schedule, when a contagious illness is diagnosed we also carry out thorough deep cleans throughout the whole nursery, ensuring that all resources and surfaces are thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with Milton. Extra members of staff are drafted in at these times to ensure that the deep cleans take effect quickly and thoroughly without too much disruption to the children and their routines.

If your child/ children become ill and you are asked to keep them off nursery for the duration of their exclusion period, please understand that this is the best and quickest way to for us to combat the spread of infection. All nurseries and schools operate in this way and Toy Box is no different.

In the meantime it is important that your child/ children have good warm outdoor clothing so they can play outdoors every day to get fresh air. Staff also ensure that all the windows are opened daily to allow the nursery to air and help clear any potential germs lurking around.

If any parent/ carer would like further clarification on our cleaning routines please speak to Anna and she will be delighted to answer any queries you may have.

As always, thank you all for your continuing support. Your opinions and thoughts are really important to us. All your comments and suggestions, be they good or not so good, are always listened to and acted upon if necessary.
