Welcome back to the start of a brand new Academic Year here at Toy Box Day Nursery.

# Baby Room

Throughout the month, as well as enjoying their beach party, the babies also had great fun exploring in the mud kitchen with various spoons and investigating the outdoor area. This allowed them to explore different textures and learn different vocabulary. They have also been very busy taking part in food tasting, trying various different foods (even lemons and limes!). The experience allowed the children to talk about senses, textures and smells. It also gave the children the independence to feed themselves, make choices and promote trying new foods. This month the babies have particularly enjoyed exploring in the home corner with a wide variety of real foods to play with, this enabled the children to act out their experiences at home, explore print and interact with each whilst doing this.

# **Baby Room Beach Party**

The Baby Room's Beach Party was a huge hit. The children thoroughly enjoyed playing in the sand and water in their swimming costumes, making decorations and playing beach-themed games. This annual event is always a favourite with both the children and staff alike.

# Pre-School Room

The older children have enjoyed textured play this month. They have explored in moon sand and lots of other different textures such as jelly, cornflour and also baked beans. This led to discussions about foods that the children are familiar with, what are their favourites as well as healthy and unhealthy options to help them understand the importance of a balanced diet and healthy lifestyle. The pre-school children have also had fun making people this month using wooden pegs, various materials and also paint. This allowed a great opportunity for self-representation and self-expression, talking about similarities and differences between themselves and their peers.

We have also been very busy exploring in coloured spaghetti where we were discussing all the different colours. The children used the tweezers and the scissors to manipulate the

spaghetti, working on their hand and eye coordination and fine motor skills. Rulers were provided to measure the spaghetti and talk about different numerals.
