Pre-School Room

Throughout August the children in Preschool have been learning about nature in summer. They have explored a range of natural materials that can be found in our environment during the summer months. They have used these natural materials to print, make collages and to make a fairy garden. They have also learnt about the seaside, including what animals can be found on the sand and in the sea and talked about how we can look after our beaches. They have also talked about the changes in weather and what we need to do to protect ourselves from the sun such as putting on suncream, wearing sunhats and sunglasses. They have been out on a few trips to explore our local community and see how the environment changes in summer.

Calpol - Please be aware that if your child is unwell and unable to take part in normal activities and require Calpol/ Ibuprofen to do so they should not attend the setting. A temperature indicates that your child is fighting an infection and medication can mask the temperature. If your child has been advised by a GP to take calpol alongside any other medication then a medication form will need to be filled in. If your child has just had their immunisations a dose of calpol if fine.

Toddler Room

This month the toddlers have been exploring and learning about Minibeasts. They have been on bug hunts in the garden, made colourful butterfly pictures and used small world toys to create a bug hotel. They have learnt about the colours of the insects, counted legs and wings and also developed their fine motor skills by using tweezers in a spider web game to collect the spiders in the web.

Baby Room

The babies have been exploring the colours of summer and the sea. They have explored a sand sensory bin, vellow lemon scented water and painted with bright summer colours. They developed fine motor skills by pushing shells into playdough and developed gross motor skills in the water stations and sand pit in the garden. They have also enjoyed a wonderful lift the flap storybook about sea animals.

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Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The children in the pre school room are going to be learning about "All About Me" during September. At home you can talk about how we are all different by talking about eye, hair and skin colour. You could encourage your child to draw a picture of themselves asking them to choose the correct eye colour and hair colour. You could also talk about how different families are and talk about your own families. Talk about their favourite meals and get your child to help you make them. You could also talk about your child's favourite colour and paint a picture.

Toddler room

The children in the toddler room are also going to talking about the theme "All About Me". You can join in at home by looking in mirrors and talking about hair colour and eye colour and the length of their hair. You could also discuss about your child's favourite biscuits and bake them

Measure your child and talk about how tall they are growing and keep measuring how big they are getting over time. You could also talk to your child about their favourite colours and draw pictures using their favourite colours.

Baby Room

The babies are going to be learning about themselves and the world around them through sensory exploration. You can join in at home by exploring a variety of messy play activities such as dried cereals, water, natural objects or any other materials that provide a variety of textures.

You can also use mirrors so your child can see themselves. Play games such as finding eyes, nose and mouth, for older babies you could sing "head, shoulders knees and toes".

Going for a walk is a wonderful way for babies to experience and explore the world around them.
